

# Beloit Memorial High School Jazz Orchestra (Jazz Band I) Course Syllabus 2018-2019

**Schedule:** M-F, Term 1-4, Block 1

**Instructor:** Mr. Chris Behrens

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#### COURSE DESCRIPTION

Jazz Band I is the premiere jazz course for advanced-level jazz musicians which offers students the opportunity to study and perform a variety of jazz styles and further develop improvisational skills. A strong emphasis is placed on the learning and developing basic jazz vocabulary through active listening, memorization of jazz standards, and basic jazz theory and improvisation. All students enrolled are required to participate in all performances.

Concurrent enrollment in Wind Ensemble or Concert Band is a perquisite for participation (see exception below).

Seniors who are taking a Porter Scholar class at Beloit College are excused from participating in the Wind Ensemble, HOWEVER they are still REQUIRED to be a member of the BMHS Pep Band (which includes ALL Pep Band / Marching performances).

## **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

- 1) Learn fundamentals of jazz improvisation, knowledge of jazz theory, and vocabulary
- 2) Strengthen fundamentals of jazz improvisation and expand knowledge of jazz vocabulary
- 3) Refine elements of proper instrumental technique
- 4) Listen to, analyze, describe, and evaluate music using specific criteria for quality and effectiveness
- 5) Strengthen sight-reading abilities

#### **CLASSROOM EXPECTATIONS**

- Students are expected to contribute positively in rehearsals by coming to class prepared, with all materials, and being prepared to start class on time.
- Students will always focus on the success of the group by eliminating distractions. All phones, books, and electronic devices should be left in your backpack.
- Rehearsals are time to work collectively, not individually. Rehearsals (daily classes and/or evening rehearsals / clinics, etc.) are not to learn your part rather they are to learn everyone else's part and therefore, the music. At this level, learning your part is your responsibility. This is the professional standard.

## TARDY POLICY

Tardiness affects the performance and learning environment of all band students. Students will be given a verbal warning and lose participation points after their first unexcused tardy. After the first offense, ensemble contribution grades will be will lowered.

# **REQUIRED MATERIALS**

#### Instruments

Students are encouraged to rent or buy an instrument for daily use. Students that do not own an instrument may check out an instrument from the BMHS instrument inventory, if available. There is not enough inventory to supply students with two instruments (one for home use and one for school use).

#### o Sheet Music, Folders & Pencils

Music and folders are supplied and on loan to students for the duration of the school year. Students are responsible for all loaned materials and must replace any missing or damaged items. Students are responsible for having a pencil in class at all times. Folders must be stored away in the designated folder slot at all times unless the folder is taken home. Students should not leave folders in their lockers under any circumstances.

## Saxophone Players

Sax players are required to purchase their own reeds. Doubling may be required of saxophone players. Instruments for doubling will be checked to students by the director. It is the responsibility of each student to bring all doubles to EVERY rehearsal.

## o Brass Players

Brass students should own a bottle of valve oil and/or slide grease. Brass players must bring all mutes and doubles (Flugelhorns) to ALL rehearsals.

# **O Rhythm Section Players**

Drummers should own their own pair of (jazz) drumsticks. Bass/guitar players are required to provide their own patch chords for EVERY rehearsal.

#### Lockers

Students will be checked out a locker in the band room room. It is everyone's responsibility to put their instrument <u>in their locker after every rehearsal</u>. **Instruments may NOT be left out in the band room or studio** under any circumstances. Lockers should be used for music class only.

#### **CONCERT ATTIRE**

Concert attire for all performances is as follows:

**Girls**: Conservative black dress pants or skirt (must cover knees when seated), black dress shirt, and DRESS SHOES.

**Boys**: Black shirt or suit, black dress pants, black socks, black dress shoes.

#### GRADING

#### o Rehearsal Contribution

In addition to coming to class prepared by knowing your music, you are expected to be in your seat with your folder, instrument, and pencil on time.

#### o Homework

It is expected that each student practice for AT LEAST 2 hours a week (30 minutes a day). Students that are showing little to no improvement over the course of the semester will be placed on a practice card. Practice cards will require a parent signature and turned in on a weekly basis until the end of the quarter. In addition to individual practice, students will also receive written homework assignments as determined by the Director.

#### Exams

Students should be prepared to demonstrate the ability to play parts by themselves or in a small group at any time.

- Playing Exams will be graded on accuracy, intonation, tone quality, dynamics, and musicality.
- Written Exams / Assignments, Essays will be on musical terms, music theory, music history as well as self-reflection / written critiques of performances and / or rehearsals.

#### Sectionals

Sectionals for BMJO will be scheduled as needed. These may meet outside of the regular scheduled class time, as well as during class.

#### **Clinics / Masterclasses**

Each year we bring in several professional jazz musicians / educators to work with the ensemble. These rehearsals are held outside of the school day and are scheduled to avoid other school-related activities when possible. Generally, these session last 3-4 hours. Participation / attendance at clinic rehearsals are required. Please see the class calendar for a list.

#### **PERFORMANCES**

Jazz Band I is a performance-based class. Application of material covered in class is demonstrated in performance. All performances are MANDATORY and are a part of the student's grade. Performance dates will be given to students in a timely manner well in advance and are always available online. Work conflicts, extra curricular sport activities or conflicts within your control, i.e. family vacations and/or trips, are not excused absences. Missed performances due to illness are excused but require a doctor's note for verification. All other conflicts will be handled individually on their own merit and must be cleared with the Director PRIOR and WELL IN ADVANCE of the performance. Missed performances will affect a student's grade by at least one full letter grades. No make-up work can or will be assigned for missed performances.

## **GRADING BREAKDOWN**

Final grades will be based on the following weighted categories and percentages for each quarter/semester:

**REHEARSAL CONTRIBUTION: 35%** 

**PERFORMANCES**: 35%

PLAYING EXAMS / WRITTEN ASSESSMENTS: 30%

# Festivals, Concerts, and Performances for the 2018-19 school year (subject to change):

Due to only having one person on a part (in most cases), it is extremely important that all members attend all events listed. Even one person missing can be detrimental to the entire group. When scheduling, we do our best to avoid other conflicts, such as athletics, theater, etc. Inevitably there will be some conflicts. However, most coaches and teachers know that we travel and participate at these events and in the past, have been very understanding with missing an occasional game or practice for an important jazz event. Make sure you communicate possible conflicts well in advance (at least a month or two) with all parties involved. Approximate costs for jazz festivals have been included.
